**CONTENT:** This advanced, intense five-hour workshop is designed to explore ways of providing ethical and accountable supervision in the clinical setting. The seminar introduces and examines the principles and methods of supervision applicable to many settings in social work. The focus of the workshop is maximizing the educational and supportive functions of supervision in human service agencies. Adult learning principles and specific techniques will be applied to increase supervisory understanding, support, education, and evaluation of supervisees. In addition, the course will provide tips for evidence-based practice and opportunities for professionals to conceptualize their own approach to supervision utilizing strengths-oriented empowering strategies. A brief review of current treatment models and documentation as it relates to supervision with supporting hand-outs, templates, and references provided.

**OBJECTIVES:** *Identify different learning styles and how to maximize learning in the supervisory sessions. Define the principles of supervision including the process and uses of power and authority. Discuss the education and support functions of the supervision and apply these concepts to practice examples. Demonstrate knowledge of critical ethical and legal supervisory principles, and obligations affecting the supervisory process including mandatory reporting and establishing no harm-no risk practices. Apply knowledge of basic elements of ethical decision-making to the process of supervision through application of case example and case study. Apply knowledge and basic elements of mandatory reporting and use of no-harm no-risk procedures.*

**PRESENTER:** **Dr. Sophia F. Dziegielewski, LISW**, is a Professor in the School of Social Work at the University of Cincinnati (UC), Ohio. She is also the Editor of the *Journal of Social Service Research*. Educational qualifications include her MSW and PhD in Social Work from Florida State University, Tallahassee, FL. Dr. Dziegielewski is a Licensed Independent Social Worker (LISW) in the State of Ohio. Prior to arriving at UC, she was Chairperson for the University of Central Florida Human Subjects Review Board, where she presided over all human subjects' research at this large (43,000 students) metropolitan university. In addition to her duties as Dean (2004 – 2008) of the School of Social Work at UC, she also served as Chair of the UC IRB, Behavioral Science Review Board in 2006 and was a board member until 2008. She has also been active in clinical practice maintaining current license in her field as well as serving as an expert witness in the courts. In the national magazine *Social Worker Today* (2003), a feature story about Dr. Dziegielewski referred to her as a "legend" in her field. She is the recipient of numerous awards, and supports her research and practice activity with over 119 publications, including seven textbooks, 79 articles, numerous book chapters, and over 400 workshops and community presentations.
